



BRYAN SANDERS

- 1975 Began ski jumping at the age of 5 with the St. Paul Ski Club. He later become the youngest St. Paul Ski Club member on the US National Team to compete in the Winter Olympic games.
- 1989 Won US Junior National Championships in Ely, MN. Named to the national team and competed in World Junior Championships in Hamar, Norway.
- 1990 US Ski Team member; skied in 15 World Cup events and represented US Team at the World Ski Flying Championship in Vikersund, Norway.
- 1991 US Ski Team member; Americup Series overall winner; 1st place Steamboat Springs Winter Carnival; finished 3rd in Iron Mountain, MI in a field of over 40 international competitors. Competed in the World Cup Ski Flying Championships at Planica, Slovenia, with his longest personal jump of 491 feet.
- 1992 US Ski Team member; named to the US Olympic Team. During the Olympic competitions held in Courchevel, France, Sanders was a member of the US squad that placed 12th in team competitions. Individually, he placed 36th and 37th respectively in competitions on the normal and large hills.
- 1993 Fourth and final season on US Ski Team. Recurring knee injuries hastened an early departure from active competition. Following retirement, he continued his participation, being named USSA – Central Division Junior Development Coach.
- 1996 Named US Domestic Coach of the Year; coached four Junior Olympic Teams for the Central Division.
